New cigars have become a vital part of the cigar industry. Every summer, nearly every cigarmaker of note unveils new offerings at the Retail Tobacco Dealers of America trade show. Here are a few of the latest noteable releases, which should be in cigar stores across the United States now.

Arturo Fuente Don Carlos Edición de Aniversario

A limited-production smoke celebrating 30 years of Tabacalera A. Fuente's Don Carlos brand.

Augusto Reyes Nativo

The Reyes family of the Dominican Republic releases its first brand bearing its name.

Camacho Liberty Serie 2006

The rarest of Camacho's lines.

C.A.O. Vision

The groundbreaking packaging on this Dominican pure looks like a laptop computer. Delayed, it should be on the market in January.

Chateau Real

A non-flavored cigar from Drew Estate, makers of Acid.

Cohiba Black

This Dominican cigar sports a broadleaf wrapper, and is the first maduro Cohiba.

Cohiba 40th Anniversary

Cuba's celebratory smoke comes in an Elie Bleu humidor of 40 cigars and sells for 15,000 euros (\$18,000). Only 4,000 cigars were made.

DaVinci

A bargain brand from Altadis U.S.A. made in Nicaragua.

Diamond Crown Maximus Stanford's 90th

Made to celebrate the late Stanford Newman's 90th birthday.

Dona Flor Reserva Especial

A brazilian paro made in limited quantities.

Dunhill Signed Range

This reincarnation of the Dunhill brand, made by Toraño Cigars Inc. for British American Tobaccos, hit the market in December.

Felipe Power Habano

A celebratory smoke from Philip Wynne to commemorate his 15 years in business.

Fonseca Cubano Limitado

One of Manuel Quesada's strongest smokes.

Joya de Nicaragua Antaño 1970 Magnum 660

A cigar answering the demand for both far and strong cigars.

La Tradition Perdomo Reserve Limited Golf Edition

A cigar aimed at golfers from Perdomo.

Litto Gomez Small Batch No. 1

A small-production eigar named after great Bourbon.

Maxx

A unique line from Alec Bradley: each size retails for \$5.

Oliva Master Blends 3

Oliva Cigar's most expensive line is reblended with each incarnation.

Partagas 160 Signature Series

General Cigar's second release of cigars made with Cameroon wrapper from 1977 to 1981.

Saint Luis Rey Serie G

A line extension featuring extra-fat, dark cigars-

Zino Davidoff 100th Anniversary

Three eigars made to honor the late founder of the Davidoff brand.

Economy-Priced Cigars with First-Class Ratings

Whether we're in an economic recession or in an upswing, everyone likes to save a buck. Cigar smokers are no exception, although true aficionados rarely sacrifice quality for money. Luckily, they don't have to. Quality tobacco and the ingenuity of master blenders have given frugal connoisseurs a variety of cigars to choose from this year. We scoured our database for cigars scoring no lower than 88 points with a suggested retail price of no higher than \$4. The result was 21 cigars—that's three fewer than last year, but more than twice as many scored 90 points or higher. Two qualifying cigars are not listed here—the Saint Luis Rey Belicoso and Oliva Grand Cameroon Robusto—because they made it into the Top 25 Cigars of the Year. (The makers of the Oliva Grand Cameroon brand changed its name to Oliva Serie G Cameroon since its initial rating.) • Brands such as the Honduran Saint Luis Rey are no stranger to this best buy list. Newcomers such as the Honduran Quintero and the reblended Don Tomás Clasico are welcomed additions. The scores in the list below first appeared in CIGAR AFICIONADO or Cigar Insider throughout 2006.

Oliva Serie G Cameroon Robusto

The price of this cigar seems impossibly low. Oliva Cigar Co. has been making cigars for 11 years, and its early struggles in the post-cigar-boom world forced the company to create exceptional values. This Cameroon-cloaked robusto is one of the company's best. The toothy African leaf pairs well with the sublime Nicaraguan tobaccos that make up the filler blend and binder. As part of a

redesign of all of the company's brands, the cigar was originally rated as the Oliva Grand Cameroon, but is now known as the Oliva Serie G Cameroon. The price was raised a modest 15 cents but the blend remains the same, Cuban-seed Nicaraguan tobaccos mixed with Cameroon wrapper. The box-pressed robusto, which measures 4 1/2 by 50, is elegant and sweet, with nice balance.
